Abstract: This collection consists of photographs, research notes, degree certificates, correspondence, and ephemera related to Dr. Robert Levere Brunhouse's academic career and life.

Biographical Note:

Robert Levere Brunhouse was an American educator in History and a writer. He taught at the University of South Alabama, Dickinson College, the University of Pennsylvania, the Elizabethtown College, and the Drew University. He obtained his bachelor's degree from Dickinson College in 1930 and both his master's and doctorate from the University of Pennsylvania in 1936 and 1940, respectively. Brunhouse was promoted to full professor at the University of South Alabama. Brunhouse's first credited book, *Counter-Revolution in Pennsylvania: 1776-1790*, was published in 1942. He produced eight other works on history and civilization. The subject of his work focused on Mayan history and culture, and his first book, submitted anonymously, titled *Miniatures of Mechanicsburg*, was published in 1928 and reissued in 1986.
